THOROUGHLY PREPARING THE TRANSITION

For months now, an immense new structure has been taking shape above the Emergency Department, one that will house the Integrated Trauma Centre, the Critical Care Unit, the Mother-Child Unit and the Endoscopy Unit. During this time, the seven-member **Transition Committee has been supporting the various teams affected by the works and preparing them for the challenges ahead**.

Tailored training sessions and weekly work meetings are planned to ensure a smooth transition. "One example of a change is the simple fact that patients will now receive care in single rooms, something that will usher in a number of clinical adjustments," explains Geneviève Blain, who heads up the organizational planning project.

Ms. Blain assures us that the building is still on track to be completed in late 2020 within the planned budget. Based on this estimate, it is expected that the first trauma, obstetrics-gynecology and endoscopy patients will be admitted into these new, ultramodern spaces in early 2021.

Head of the Building Operations and Maintenance Department at Sacré-Cœur, Michel Lortie is one of the



AN INDISPENSABLE EQUIPMENT, THANKS TO OUR DONORS!



Thanks to our generous donors, we were recently able to acquire and install the much anticipated tomosynthesis machine for the Hospital's Radiology Department, for which the **Foundation had raised over \$100,000**.

It is an important investment in improving the health of numerous women. Each year, more than 2,000 women are treated by the Sacré-Cœur team through the screening program or post-cancer monitoring. This advanced technology enables more precise examinations.

Today, tomosynthesis is an essential tool. Its main benefits are:

- Detects tumours only millimetres in size, making earlier intervention with appropriate treatment possible
- > Increases the detection rate for invasive cancer
- > Helps lower the call-back rate for another examination
- > Facilitates the analysis of anomalies detected during 2D mammography.

DID YOU KNOW ?

Tomosynthesis is a technology used to perform mammograms in three dimensions.

NUCLEAR MEDICINE: THE PET-CT SCANNER HAS BEEN ORDERED!

An order has been placed for the purchase of a digital PET-CT scanner with the necessary tools for processing and analyzing data. The equipment had been on the Hospital's Nuclear Medicine Department's wish list for several years now, and on that of a great many donors as well.

\$ 3 MILLION for this indispensable machine.


As announced in December 2018, the Nuclear Medicine Department will relocate in a new hospital wing, which will have the space needed to use the PET-CT scanner to its full potential. Planning for the new wing is in its advanced stages, with construction slated to begin by the year's end. This would make it possible to start the clinical use of the PET-CT scanner around Fall 2020.



DID YOU KNOW ?

Nuclear medicine is a branch of medicine that creates images of organs or body parts with very high precision.

The basic principle is to inject an ever-so-slightly radioactive substance into the area being examined, and then to capture the waves it emits by means of an ultrasensitive medical camera, such as the PET-CT, for example.



THE SCANNER HAS NUMEROUS CLINICAL USES. HERE ARE FEW EXEMPLES:





CARDIOLOGY



It will contribute to a better assessment of cancers, a better evaluation of responses to treatment, and the determination of the presence or absence of relapses in patients treated for several types of cancer. It will now be easier to differentiate different types of dementia in order to help clinicians develop more appropriately targeted treatment plans. it can evaluate systemic infections and assess the viability of heart tissues.



GOOD WORK DR. LEVERT!



In 2006, the head of the Nuclear Medicine Department, Dr. Valérie Levert, became the 12th female physician specializing in nuclear medicine in Quebec and the second female nuclear medicine physician to work with PET-CT technology. In 2016, she became the first female head of a nuclear medicine department in a CIUSSS in Quebec's health network.
