A LOOK AT OBESITY AND WEIGHT LOSS

Diseases related to obesity and excess weight represent a cutting-edge field at the Hôpital du Sacré-Cœur-de-Montréal. It is a reference centre for bariatric surgery and has been the provincial leader in this field for over 11 years.



EXCESS WEIGHT CAN CAUSE THE FOLLOWING DISEASES AND DISORDERS:

- Cardiovascular diseases
- Type 2 diabetes
- Musculoskeletal disorders such as osteoarthritis and certain cancers
- Sleep apnea
- Joint pain
- High blood pressure
- Hepatic steatosis



SPECIFICALLY, BARIATRIC SURGERY ALLOWS FOR:

- Progressive and sustainable weight loss
- Lower morbidity and mortality rates
- Reduction in costs and use of healthcare services
- Solutions for several diseases
- Improvement in the quality of life

A SURGERY TRANSFORMED CÉLINE PINARD'S LIFE

Céline Pinard has lived with multiple health problems ever since she was a young child. Her family doctor was no longer able to provide the adequate care that would allow her to have a good quality of life. She therefore sent her to the Endocrinology Department at the Hôpital du Sacré-Cœur. This is how Ms. Pinard became a patient of Dr. Mirna Azar, endocrinologist and specialist physician in disorders related to obesity at the Hospital.

Due to the panoply of disorders affecting her (irritable bowel syndrome, diabetes, high blood pressure, gastric reflux, high cholesterol level), it was difficult for Ms. Pinard to lose more than a few

pounds, and some medications had very undesirable side effects. So Dr. Azar suggested bariatric surgery to her, which involves reducing the volume of the stomach and would thereby resolve her various health problems.

Despite her fears, Ms. Pinard put her trust in Dr. Azar and the surgeon who would operate on her, Dr. Ronald Denis. On May 1, she underwent the surgery, which, she says, truly transformed her life. Within two months, she had lost 34 pounds. She no longer needs insulin, and several of the medications that she had needed on a daily basis have been withdrawn. She feels light and no longer has chest or stomach pains.



"This operation has prolonged my life by 10 to 15 years," says Ms. Pinard. She is very appreciative of the care she received from Dr. Azar and Dr. Denis.

50 YEARS OF COMMITMENTTO THE HOSPITAL AND ITS FOUNDATION

This year, Guy Crevier, who has been a financial consultant for 20 years, has accumulated 50 years of commitment to the Hôpital du Sacré-Cœur-de-Montréal and its Foundation. At the annual information session that took place on Wednesday May 16 this year, the Foundation awarded him an *Émilie* statuette to underscore his years of devotion.

Guy Crevier is one of the six founding members of the Foundation. Trained as an accountant, he is the Foundation's living memory – its RAM! He was in charge of the Foundation from 1976 until 1987, prior to the appointment of Michèle Maratta as the first executive director. Between 1991 and 1993 he served twice as interim executive director, and acted as the executive director from April 1993 until September 1995, while continuing to work for the Hospital.

Prior to his arrival at the Foundation, Mr. Crevier knew the Hôpital du Sacré-Cœur very well, because he had worked for the hospital facility for more than 29 years. He started on August 19, 1968 as head accountant, and from 1971 until 1979, occupied the position of administrative services director and finance director. Next, Mr. Crevier became the assistant to the executive director, responsible for internal audits and upper management, at the same time as carrying out his work with the Foundation, as mentioned above. He took a well-deserved retirement from the Hospital on September 30, 1997.

Thank you Mr. Crevier for all those years of valuable advice and devotion. We can truly say that your heart is with the Sacré-Cœur!



THE NEW **ENDOSCOPY** UNIT

A team of 24 nursing and support care professionals, as well as 23 specialist physicians, will be working in the new Endoscopy Unit. We should remind you that the overall project involves the construction of an ultra-modern building above the emergency department, that will house the integrated Trauma Centre, the Critical Care Unit, the Mother-Child Unit and the Endoscopy Unit.

Three specialties are offered in the Endoscopy Department: gastroenterology, pneumology and urology. Respiratory health has already received ministerial recognition for its cutting-edge expertise in pulmonary cancerology. It has a subspeciality team dedicated to lung cancer.

Endoscopy is a medical technique that consists of introducing a small tube called an endoscope into a cavity in order to view it. Diagnostic endoscopic procedures, as well as preventive and curative endoscopic therapies, help to limit surgical interventions and the emergence of cancers.



The project will:

- Increase capacity from 6,000 procedures to more than 11,000 annually
- Offer sufficient capacity to eliminate the waiting list starting in year 1
- Meet the increased demand for services beyond 2025.

The facilities in the Endoscopy Unit will include:

- A huge area for intervention:
 - 3 gastroenterology rooms (gastroscopy and colonoscopy)
 - 1 pneumology room
 - 1 urology room
 - 1 multi-purpose space for advanced techniques under fluoroscopy.

A recovery room:

- 14 standard gurneys
- 4 isolation gurneys.

On June 7, 2018, the Foundation's Youth Wing held its second Soirée-culte. This year the theme for the fundraising dinner was La Dolce Vita, and the event raised \$5,355 for the Mother-Child Unit at the Hospital.

About 160 people gathered at the Trattoria Piatto Pieno in Montréal to show their generosity, and their contributions will be used to purchase equipment beneficial to the health of new mothers and their babies

Each year, the Hôpital Sacré-Cœur sees over 2,000 births, a considerable number for a hospital that offers general and specialized care.
